Tourism Employment is calculated in the Tourism Satellite Account by using the tourism share of Gross Value Added (GVA). The employment numbers are generated from the 2016 Census data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

Tourism & Hospitality Employment numbers are calculated by using the above methodology and adding the hospitality employment (and removing the hospitality employment counted into tourism).
